What: Lightning Caused Wildfire Started: July 4, 2001

General Location: Fourteen Miles SE of Alpine, WY.

Current Size: Approx. 200 acres

Containment: 0% Expected Containment Date: Unknown

Threats: Fisheries: Snake River Cutthroat Trout.

Injuries: 2, Minor

Jurisdiction: USDA-Forest Service, Bridger-Teton National Forest

Other Cooperating Agencies: National Park Service, Idaho Dept. of State Lands

Remarks: A Type II Interagency Incident Management Team from the Great Basin Idaho Zone assumed control for the Greys River Complex this morning. The Greys River Complex includes the Deer Creek, Fawn, Murphy Lake, Lost Creek and Little Blind Fires.

Deer Creek Fire: Approx. 100 acres. Three and one half hand crews (73 firefighters) and one engine are working on line construction and hose lays with helicopter support for hot spots.

Fawn Fire: Approx. 100 acres. Two hand crews (41 firefighters) are working on line construction and hose lays with helicopter support for hot spots.

Murphy Lake: Approx. One and one half acres. One hand crew (8 firefighters) and one engine are working on line construction and hose lays for mop up.

Lost Creek and Little Blind Fires: Contained, Patrol by air.

Additional resources ordered include four hand crews, two helicopters and one or two engines. Fire behavior is expected to remain moderate throughout the day with group tree torching and short range spotting with light to moderate winds.

Resources on the fire: 119 Firefighters, One Type 2 Engine, One Type 4 Engine, One Type 1 Helicopter.
