What: Lightning Caused Wildfire Started: July 4, 2001

General Location: Fourteen Miles SE of Alpine, WY.

Current Size: Approx. 200 acres

Containment: 20% Expected Containment Date: Unknown

Threats: Fisheries: Snake River Cutthroat Trout.

Injuries: 2, Minor

Jurisdiction: USDA-Forest Service, Bridger-Teton National Forest

Other Cooperating Agencies: National Park Service, Idaho Dept. of State Lands, Bureau

of Land Management, US Fish and Wildlife Service, Lincoln County.

Remarks: The Greys River Complex is assigned to the Broyles Type II Interagency Incident Management Team from the Great Basin Idaho Zone. The Greys River Complex includes the Deer Creek, Fawn, Murphy Lake, Lost Creek and Little Blind Fires.

Deer Creek Fire: Approx. 100 acres. Five hand crews (100 firefighters) and two engines are working on line construction and hose lays with helicopter support for hot spots.

Fawn Fire: Approx. 100 acres. Eight hand crews (160 firefighters) are working on line construction and hose lays with helicopter support for hot spots.

Murphy Lake: Approx. 1.5 acres. Contained, Ground Patrol for hot spots.

Lost Creek and Little Blind Fires: Contained, Patrol by air.

Five engines are assigned to the complex for Initial Attack in the Greys River Drainage.

Fire behavior is expected to remain moderate with group tree torching and short range spotting and light to moderate winds. Chance of precipitation – 25%

Resources on the fire: Four Type One Hand Crews, Nine Type Two Crews Seven Engines, Two Type 2 Helicopters.
